#### **About DEG's Advice Service**

Dharriwaa Elders Group ("DEG") finds that it is "consulted" and visited by agencies and organisations regularly. Because DEG is not funded holistically and its services have been greatly reduced by governments, the organisation is now forced to monetise its services that have value to those with funds. If you are required to and/or find it useful to visit Walgett and talk with its Elders to better perform your responsibilities, we ask that you prepare your budgets accordingly, and plan your visit with us well in advance of your arrival. Advice packages can be purchased as below. In addition to the listed services, DEG can design other packages to suit your purpose. We are flexible and innovative. All quoted package prices exclude GST.

#### **Facilities**

The Dharriwaa Elders Group Elders Centre has a data projector and screen, large reversible whiteboard on wheels, kitchen and BBQ, 2 toilets and private areas. Wheelchair access is available.

The Dharriwaa Elders Group (DEG) believes this service will support fruitful relationships and provide greater understandings to enable you to meet your obligations and provide better services in our community.

### **Our story**

Our group was born 20 November 2000 after working together on projects since 1998. We took our name from one of our sacred sites - Narran Lakes - Dharriwaa (common meeting place) and our full members are Aboriginal people over 60 who live in Walgett. The Dharriwaa Elders Group has a 16 year history in Walgett of benchmarking governance, including financial accountability and inclusivity. DEG combines the traditional values of its members with the willingness to work together with government and other stakeholders to achieve real outcomes for the Walgett community.

#### Written advice

DEG has prepared many reports from workshops it has conducted including Walgett Aboriginal Women's Priorities, the NSW Alcohol Summit, a Framework for NSW Land Management, NSW Native Vegetation and Aboriginal Cultural Heritage legislation.

In DEG's Advice Service, Aboriginal Elders, supported by DEG staff, receive and present information and respectful advice in safe, familiar surroundings. Our personal experience and advice are offered in the spirit of goodwill.

Our advice offers guidance and recommendations for prudent action. It has costs and is valuable.
